

# TESTING DOES NOT CHANGE THE TREATMENT

There are test kits in Ohio and in Ottawa County and it is possible to test for COVID-19 but only with doctor's orders. State Testing kits are reserved for people who are extremely ill, hospitalized patients, first responders and health care workers. Private lab testing can be ordered through your physician. Symptoms of COVID-19 include: Fever, Cough, Shortness of breath.



## STAY INFORMED \* STAY SAFE \* STAY HOME!

- If you're feeling symptoms related to COVID-19, STAY HOME!
- **Separate yourself** from other household members and stay in home isolation until 3 things have happened:



At least 7 days have passed since symptoms first appeared



Have been fever-free for 72 hours (3 days) without use of medication



Other symptoms have improved, such as cough or shortness of breath

### ISOLATION

For people who are ill

- Separates people who have a very contagious disease from those who are healthy.
- Restricts the movement of people who have contagious disease to stop the spread of illness.

### QUARANTINE

For people who have been exposed but not ill

- Applies to people who are not yet ill, but have been exposed to very contagious disease.
- Applies to the separation and restriction of movements of people.
- Is a public health strategy to stop the spread of a very contagious disease.

The Ottawa County Health Department **cannot** test for COVID-19 at this time and **cannot** evaluate you to determine if testing is necessary. Again, **testing is only ordered if you have met criteria and must be completed by a physician.**

Please take advantage of telehealth services right now if you are able. This allows you to be evaluated from your home if you are ill protecting you and others from the spread of this virus.

**Magruder Hospital has set up a COVID-19 hotline that will be staffed 24 / 7**

You may call **419-301-4304**, a nurse will screen you for symptoms and advise self-monitoring, reporting to the respiratory urgent care, or reporting to the emergency room at the hospital. It is very important that you call this number **before** reporting to the emergency room.

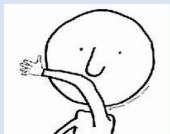
